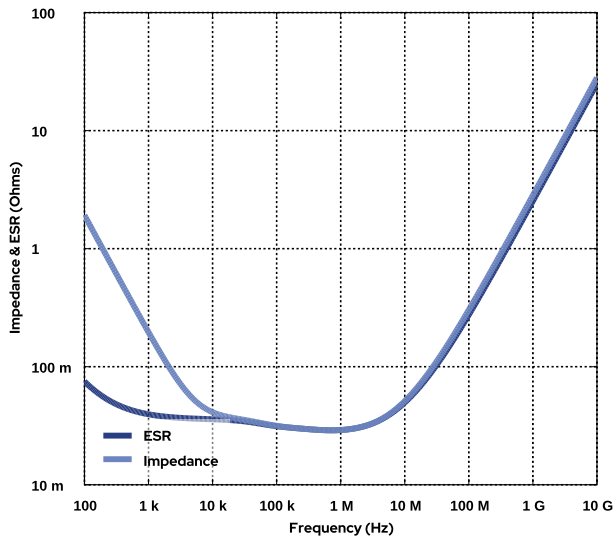

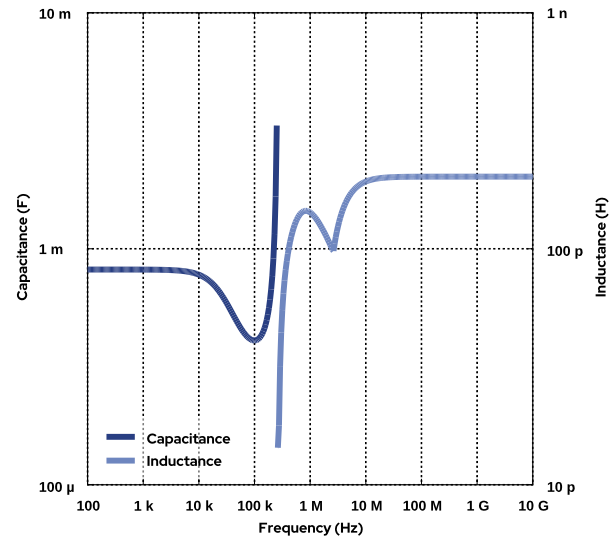

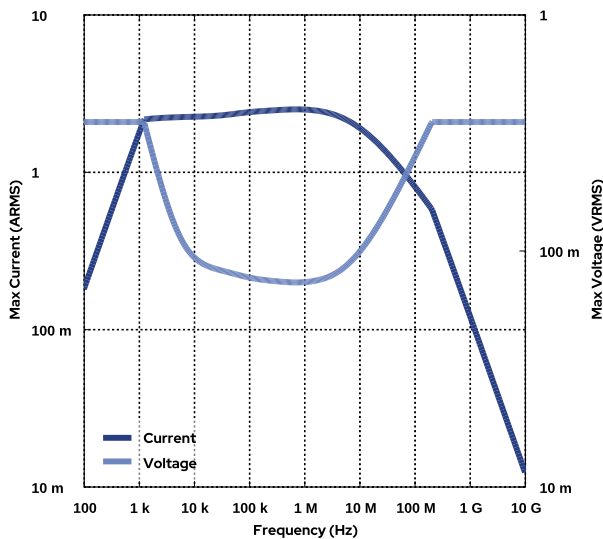
Impedance and ESR



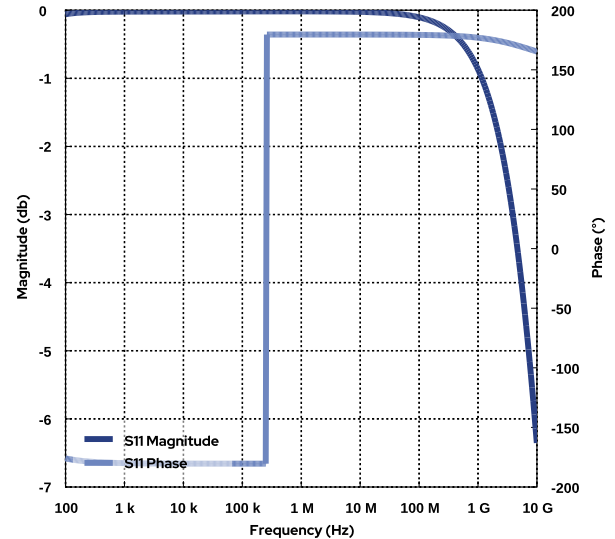
Capacitance and Inductance

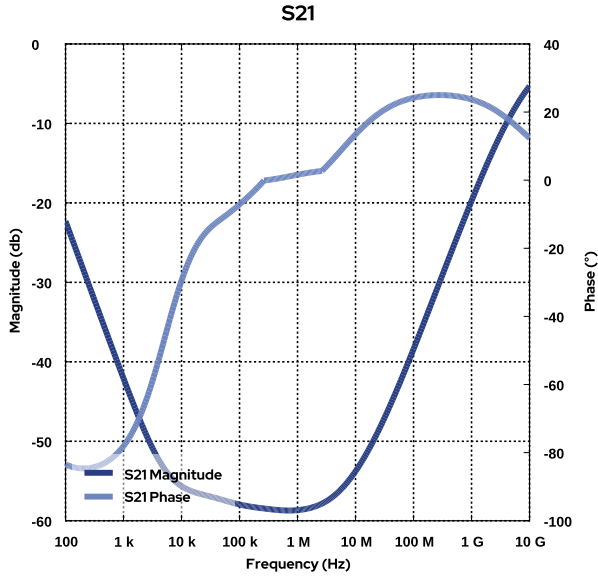


Current and Voltage
